Dual-Enrollment Programs

Dual –enrollment allows high school students earn college credit at a low cost .

Registration Dates:

April 15th for Fall Semester

October 15th for the Winter Semester

February 15th for the Summer Semester

Eligibility:

- ⇒ Enrolled in at least one high school class and pursing a high school diploma
- ⇒ Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or high
- ⇒ Approval by your high school counselor
- ⇒ Able to meet GRCC course prerequisites

How to apply:
